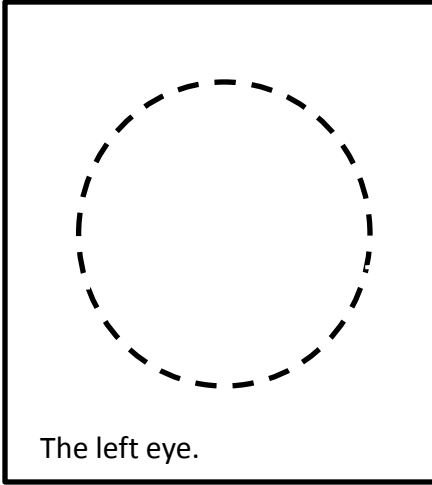
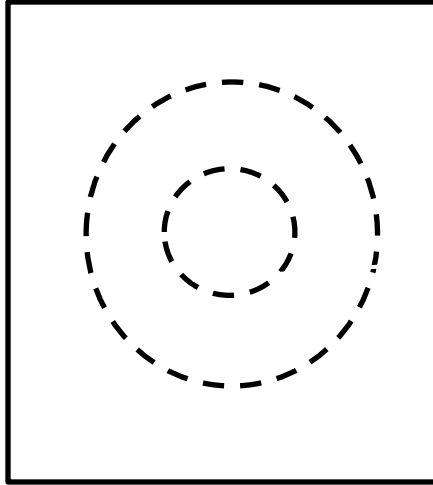


The Eye Project: Art and Science

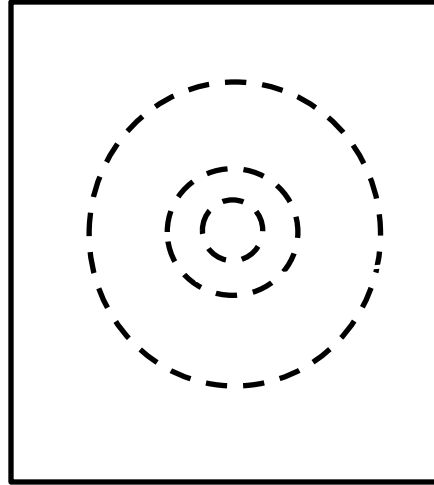
*Study the eyes on the 'Keep Your Eye on the Arts' poster to see how other students have treated the various parts of the eye.



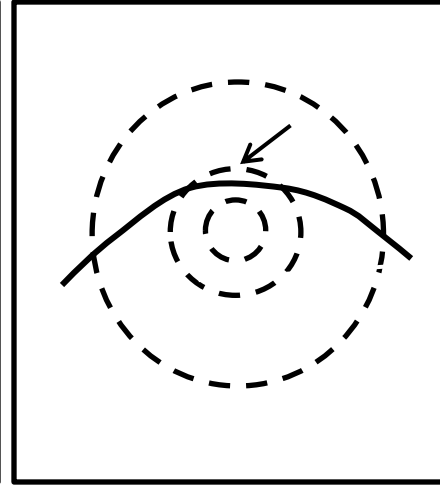
1. Lightly trace a five inch circle (plastic coffee can lid) in the center of an 8.5 inch square of heavy paper. This is the size of the eye ball, the part that is white (sclera).



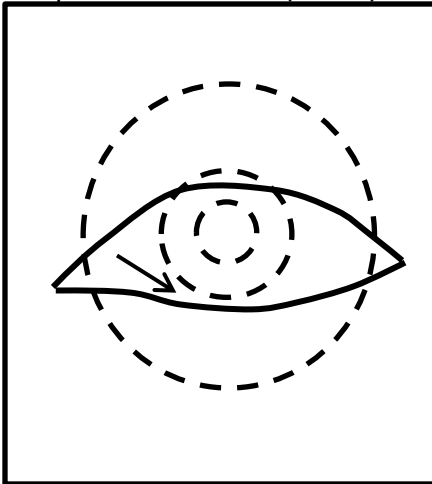
2. Lightly trace a 2.5 to 3 inch circle (cap of a can of spray paint) in the center of the first circle. This is the size of the iris, the colored part of the eye.



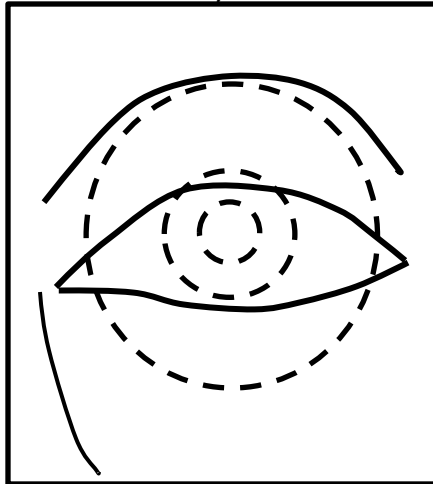
3. Lightly trace a one inch circle (ketchup bottle cap) in the center of the second circle. This is the pupil, the black appearing center of the eye which is an opening.



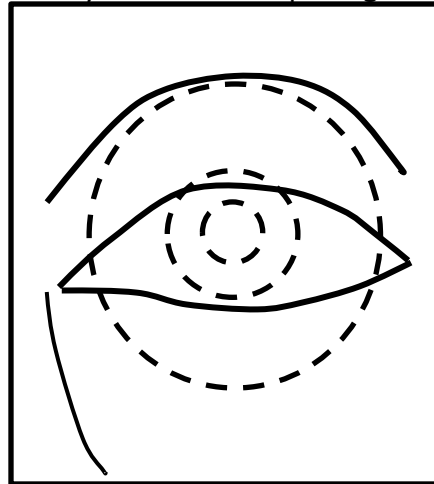
4. Draw a line representing the upper eye lid which cuts across and slightly below the second circle (iris). You can erase the part of the second circle that is above this line.



5. Draw a line representing the upper eye lid. This line cuts just below the second circle (iris).




6. Draw in the edge of the nose and also the eyebrow line, which touches the top of the large circle but flairs out at the ends.



7. Start coloring the eye using oil pastels which allow for the blending of multiple colors by rubbing with the finger. Color to the edge of the paper.



8. Add the reflection point  using a spot of white, and draw the eye lashes using thin, wispy lines of black that arch up or down and out.
