

## **'SELFIES'**The Old-Fashioned Way



Use the above rough grid to help your students get the placement and proportions for the head and its features. Enlarge the above picture to fit onto 8½" x 11" copy paper, then have them practice drawing heads by having them either look at a classmate across the table or use head-on shots of people in magazines as reference. The eye, nose, and lips drawing instructions can be found on <u>eTriarco.com</u>. The neck lines differ from person to person depending on the thickness and length of the neck. Once your students have had time to practice this exercise, give them a mirror and have them work on a self-portrait. Emphasize capturing the details that make them look like the individual that they are.

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
