What's Your Taste in Art?

Once drawn, students can use any **combination** of media to color their drawing. This can include:

- water color
- acrylic]
- tempera
- colored pencil
- colored marker
- oil pastels
- chalk pastels
- collage
- pen and ink
- charcoal
- lead pencil

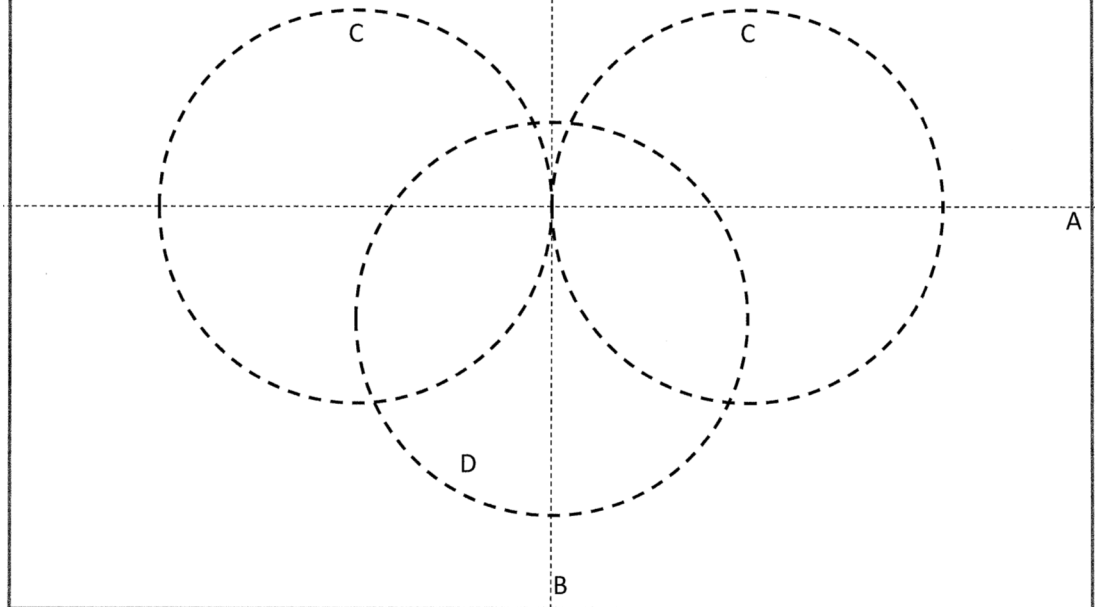
This is a **multi-media** project.

No digital or computerized work is acceptable unless it is part of a collage.

If soft pastels or charcoal are used, the art work must be sprayed with a fixative.

The art work **must** cover the complete 9x12 sheet of paper.

This is the plan for a simple sketch using 4.5 inch dairy product container covers and works well for elementary students who are just learning how to look and draw. Older students can use this or simply draw from life by looking in a mirror or at a classmate. Take a piece of 9X12 inch white card stock or similar heavy paper and **very lightly** draw lines at the half-way point vertically (A) and horizontally(B). Trace the cover on both sides of the vertical line so that approximately half the circle is above the line and half is below the line (C). Trace the cover again to form circle (D) so that it is placed similar to the drawing below.



Lightly draw lines, as below, to form the outline of the upper and lower lips and the line where they come together. The circles and the vertical and horizontal lines can now be erased leaving the lip outline behind. The tongue can be added now and it is fun to have the students work in pairs and to pose for each other showing what they think the mouth and tongue should look like to give the sense of 'MMMMMM' as though something good has just been tasted. The six different art works that make up the Triarco 'What's Your Taste in Art' poster will give students a good idea of how different artists have interpreted this project.
